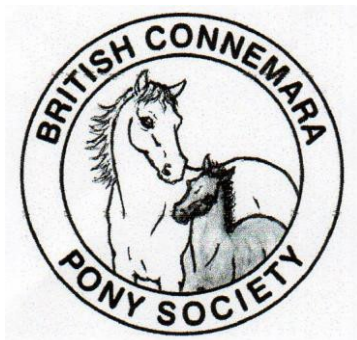

To comply with BCPS Showing Rules no filly/mare four years old or over may be shown unless it has been inspected.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society. NPS rules for showing apply.

Riders of stallions must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. All riders while mounted must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats.

Foals must be over 4 weeks old on the day of the show and must accompany the mare into the ring.

All ponies must be registered by the closing date of entries in the appropriate section of the BCPS Stud Book or Register, in the Stud Book of a recognised Connemara Society or in the Part-Bred Register where applicable.

ENTRIES ARE ACCEPTED ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT EXHIBITORS HAVE READ THESE RULES. The show rules can be found at www.britishconnemaras.co.uk BCPS tab under-about the BCPS. A copy of the show rules may also be obtained from the secretary please enclose a SAE. It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to enter their ponies correctly in the appropriate class. **No swapping/changing classes will be allowed at the Show.**

Neither the organisers of this event nor the BCPS, nor any agent or representative thereof accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness or any other loss of any kind whether financial or otherwise suffered by any horse, pony, spectator, land, buildings, person, animal or any other property of any type whether caused by negligence, breach of contract, breach of trust or in any other way whatsoever.

It is a condition of entry that all exhibitors shall, to the extent allowed by law, indemnify this Show, Moreton Morrell Equestrian, its Officials, Servants and Assistants against all actions, proceedings, claims or otherwise in relation to or arising from their entries in the Show, and each entry form **MUST** be signed as having accepted these conditions.

The Committee reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes as and when necessary. The Committee reserves the right to accept substitute ponies.

ANY PONY TAKING PART IN CLASSES AT THIS SHOW MAY BE LIABLE TO RANDOM DRUG TESTING.

The Council strongly recommend the wearing of body protectors for jumping competitors.

In the event of excess heat safety precautions will be taken for all handlers/riders and their ponies/horses. Water will be available on the Show Field.

COVID GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS. Everyone must read and abide by the Covid 19 rules, all Government Guidelines and Restrictions in place at the time of the show. **DO NOT ATTEND THE SHOW IF YOU ARE DISPLAYING SYMPTOMS OF CORONAVIRUS.**

All Horses/Ponies should be vaccinated and have the minimum of their annual booster or have had their 2nd inoculation within a minimum of 7 days before competing at Moreton Morrell.

NPS Qualifying Rounds Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective M&M stud books. Part-Breds are not eligible for M&M classes. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members. **The owner of a pony qualifying at a breed show must become an NPS Qualifying/Life member in order to compete at the final.** The highest placed pony in each eligible class will qualify for the final. Qualification will pass no lower than 3rd place. **NPS Silver Medal Rosettes** can be awarded to ponies at breed shows even if their owners are not NPS members but to enter the final they must become an **NPS Qualifying/Life member**. The highest placed eligible pony from classes 38-41, 43-46, 48-49 will qualify for the NPS/Niart Stud M&M In Hand National Summer Championship. The highest placed pony from classes 38-41,43-46,48-49 wearing a white armband will qualify for the NPS/Mole Valley Farmers M&M Home-Produced In Hand National Championship. The NPS/Corscaron Essentials Home Produced Ridden National Championship qualifying classes are 5 & 8. All entering as **Home Produced must wear white arm bands.**

Class 1 Very Novice Ridden Stallion or Gelding four years old and over.

Never to have won a 1st Prize in any ridden M&M Class by the closing date of entries. The Winner to receive the relevant Trophy Card.

Class 2 Very Novice Ridden Mare four years old and over.

Never to have won a 1st Prize in any ridden M&M Class by the closing date of entries. The Winner to receive the relevant Trophy Card.

NOVICE CHAMPIONSHIP

1st and 2nd Prize Winners in Classes 1 & 2 to compete. The Champion to receive the relevant Trophy Card.

Class 3 The NPS/Picton Stud M&M Novice Ridden Championship Qualifier.

Class 4 The NPS/Dargavel M&M Young Open Ridden Pony Championship Qualifier.

Stallions, Mares, or Geldings four, five or six years old. The highest placed four-, five- and six-year-olds to qualify. To be judged under National Pony Society Rules 2023.

Class 5 The NPS M&M Junior Ridden National Championship Qualifier.

To be judged under National Pony Society Rules 2023. The Winner to receive the relevant Trophy Card. The Best Pony ridden by a child and owned by the child or their Parent/Guardian to receive the relevant Trophy Card – please wear an armband if you are eligible.

Class 6 Ridden Pony not exceeding 143cms.

Stallions, Mares, or Geldings four years old and over.

Class 7 The NPS/Peasedown Stud & Jess Talbot M&M Intermediate Ridden National Championship Qualifier.

Stallions, Mares, and Geldings five years old and over. To be judged under National Pony Society Rules 2023. The Winner to receive the relevant Trophy Card.

Class 8 The NPS/Ringside Stud M&M Open Ridden National Championship Qualifier.

Stallions, Mares, and Geldings five years old and over. To be judged under National Pony Society Rules 2023.

Class 9 Horse of the Year Show Mountain & Moorland Ridden Pony of the Year Qualifier 2023.

This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of their respective stud books. Riders and Owners must be members of their respective Breed Society, NPS, UK Ponies & Horses, The Showing Register or BSPS. Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders of stallions must have obtained their 12th birthday (small breeds) or 14th birthday (large breeds) before 1st January in the current year.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Ltd and stored on the Grandstand Entries system. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Show, Freedom of Action 50 maximum.

Breed Type and Conformation 50 maximum.

In the cases of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the Judges' decision will be final.

This Class is a qualifying Class for the Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 4th – 8th October 2023. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

This class entitles eligible amateur combinations to earn points for the Premier Amateur League, with the opportunity of gaining a wild card place at HOYS 2023. This is open to current TSR members or those that have signed up to the Premier Amateur League 2023, for more information see www.theshowingregister.co.uk.
