Grooms and other helpers other than the person leading the horse or pony who fail to comply with stewards requests to leave the horse walk may be subject to disqualification.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Postal Entry forms for all classes must be completed by the owner or representative and sent to the Secretary: Marion Hardy, 4 Knutsford Road Cottages, Knutsford Road, Chelford, Macclesfield, Cheshire, SK11 9AS. Some entries on the day may be taken (please see schedule for eligible classes). Entries will be taken on the day with a surcharge of £5 and £10 for RIHS Qualifying classes. No BRITISH SHOWJUMPING entries will be taken on the day. British Showjumping Exhibits Only In the event of insufficient entries Rule 76.6 will be adhered to in all classes.
- 2. Cheques must be made payable to The Cheshire Horse Show Ltd. ALL COMPETITOR NUMBERS TO BE COLLECTED ON SHOW DAY
- 3. Owners may enter as many horses as they wish, and all competitors are open unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
- 4. Entries will **NOT BE ACCEPTED** unless accompanied by the correct fees (and must include first aid tariff of £4 per competitor). Horse boxes will be checked on entry to the showground and any additional passengers, with the exception of Owner/Rider/Groom will be charged a discounted rate of £5.00 per person. Please have the correct money available to help keep the traffic flow moving.
- 5. Under no circumstances will entries be changed, substituted or amended once received. Any entries received after the closing date will be subject to the additional fee. Entries will only be accepted on the official entry form. In the event of a horse or pony being unable to compete through illness, accident or the like, the Society will refund the whole of the entry fee on production of a Veterinary Certificate, (except in the case of British Showjumping exhibits, which are provided for under British Showjumping rules please refer to British Showjumping rule book).
- 6. Exhibitor's boxes and Exhibits must stand in the space allocated for their purposes. The Society will strictly enforce this condition.
- 7. Entries to be on showground half an hour before judging.
- 8. ALL PRIZE MONEY MUST BE COLLECTED ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW OTHERWISE IT WILL BE FORFEITED. No prize money will be given out without production of the Exhibitors number, rosette and class number. Prize money will be awarded once results received by Treasurer.
- 9. All trophies must be returned in good condition at least one month prior to the date of the next Show.
- 10. Hats: A 'Riding Hat', designed to provide protection, must be worn, at all times when mounted by anyone, whether or not a Competitor, at a British Showjumping competition. Harnesses must be properly adjusted and fastened at all times when mounted. When jumping, including warming up, all Competitors must wear 'Protective Headwear' i.e. a hat which meets one of the following standards:
 - British: All PAS 015, VG1 and European VG1, provided they are BSI Kitemarked
 - **ALL RIDDEN CLASS COMPETITORS** must wear a hard hat to the current BSI and EU standard unless they are competing in Classes 62 63 **and** have signed a Hat Waiver Form requested from Secretary or downloaded from www.theeguinelanecheshirehorseshow.co.uk.
- 11. It is recommended that competitors involved in jumping wear a body protector of the appropriate BSI and EU standard.
- 12. A levy of £4.00 will be charged per competitor towards the cost of First Aid provision.
- 13. In Light horse classes (excluding qualifying classes) where there are less than 6 entries, prize money will be awarded to 1st place only. Rosettes to 4th place will be awarded.
- 14. **Showing Exhibits Only -** NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE GIVEN, except in the event of unforeseen cancellation of the show, when a £5.00 levy will be deducted from each entry to cover Administration costs. **British ShowJumping Exhibits Only -** Please note there will be no refunds given 72 hours prior to the show taking place. In the event of unforeseen cancellation of the show, a £5 administration charge will be deducted from each entry.

This show is affiliated to the Shire Horse Society. A Silver Spoon and Rosette will be awarded to the Champion mare or filly eligible in classes subject to the Shire Horse Society conditions of offer.

This show is affiliated to The British Ridden Heavy Horse Society and is a Qualifier for the **British Ridden Heavy Horse Society Kilmannan Championship.** Open to horses 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British stud books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Society at the time of qualification and must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered in. The highest placed registered Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron in an affiliated ridden heavy horse class to qualify for the BRHHS Championship, qualification to go down no lower than third place and there has to be three horses forward in the ring for the qualifier to be awarded. Riders of Stallions must be 16 years or over. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Ridden Heavy Horse Championship to be held at Equifest on Saturday,20th August 2A22.

This show is part of the Mobberley Members Champion Foal of the Year. Points for this competition are 1st - 5, 2nd - 3 and 3rd - 1 points.

This show is affiliated to the NCPA (Affiliation Number 103/22) and is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show in September 2022. 1st & 2nd prizewinners in Classes 1 - 9 will qualify.

RIDDEN SHOW HUNTER HORSE CLASSES - Ring 1

This show is affiliated to the Sport Horse Breeding (GB). All horses must be on the basic register of SHB (GB) for classes 10 - 16. Riders and owners must be current members of Sport Horse (GB). In classes 11-16 all horses also have to be on the 2022 (SHB(GB)) show hunter register. Classes 11 -16 are RIHS qualifiers (entries will include an RIHS levy of £10.00) and in classes 11-16 the first two in each class will qualify. In classes 15 & 16 in the Lightweight section, the two highest placed smalls and the two highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the Heavyweight section the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify. Day Ticket = £36 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 show's in the year at £36 per show – it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration/overstamp for that show). IF THE CLASS IS A QUALIFYING CLASS FOR RIHS, IN ORDER FOR THE QUALIFICATION TO BE VALID, APPLICATION FOR FULL OWNER/RIDER MEMBERSHIP AND HORSE REGISTRATION/OVERSTAMP MUST BE RECEIVED IN THE SHB(GB) OFFICE WITHIN 14 DAYS. It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS 015; VG1, (BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001, E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. It is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats. In the jumping phase of working hunter classes the aforementioned skull caps/riding hats must be worn.

This show is affiliated to Ponies Association (UK) (Affiliation Number 22/A18/8305). UK PONIES & HORSES GOLD MEDAL SERIES - Classes 12 – 16 are qualifiers for the Gold Medal Series at the 2023 UKPH Spring Classic, Equifest

2023 and BSPA 2023. **The 1**st, **2**nd **& 3**rd **in each qualifying class will qualify**. Qualification cards will not be awarded in the ring however placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary.

This show is affiliated to the NCPA (Affiliation Number 103/22) and is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show in September 2022. 1st & 2nd prizewinners in Class 10 will qualify.

Special Prizes: The Lord Daresbury Perpetual Challenge Cup will be awarded to the champion Hunter.

- Class 10 NCPA Qualifier Novice Hunters Mare or gelding 4 years or over not having been awarded a first prize value of £60 or total of £200 (or equivalent values) in any SHB(GB) affiliated Ridden Hunter Classes at home or abroad before 1st January in current year, excepting all prize money awarded as a four year old. Any horse that qualifies for HOYS in a Ridden Hunter Class will not be eligible to compete in Novice classes from 1st January the following year but horses that qualified for HOYS as a 4 year old are exempt.
- Class 11 **RIHS Small Hunter Qualifier -** Mare or gelding 4 years or over, exceeding 148cms but not to exceed 158cms. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.
- Class 12 **RIHS Lightweight Hunter Qualifier -** Mare or gelding 4 years or over, exceeding 158cms, capable of carrying up to 12.7 stone. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.
- Class 13 **RIHS Middleweight Hunter Qualifier -** Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms, capable of carrying 12.7 stone but not 14 stone. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.
- Class 14 RIHS Heavyweight Hunter Qualifier Mare or gelding 4 years and over, exceeding 158cms and capable of carrying over 14 stone. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

Championship: The Horses placed first and second in Classes 11 - 14 are eligible to go forward to the championship.

Championship to take place after Class 14.

- Class 15 RIHS Amateur Ridden Hunter Lightweight Qualifier Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying 12.7 stone and under. Small Hunters to be included in this category.
- Class 16 **RIHS Amateur Ridden Hunter Heavyweight Qualifier -** Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying over 12.7 stone. Middleweight Hunters to be included in this category.

AMATEUR HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP - The Horses placed first and second in Classes 15 & 16 are eligible to go forward to the championship.

Championship to take place after Class 16.

HACK CLASSES – Ring 4

This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Horse Association (BSHA). RIHS Qualifying Classes are held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association (BSHA). Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form. Classes 18 & 19 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then third will go forward. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Longines Royal International Horse Show 26-31 July 2022 must submit their entries ONLINE at: www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter Sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The highest placed unqualified prize winners in all **Open** affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of the Year Classes at the National Championship Show September 2022.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

DAY TICKETS - Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and

Open Affiliated classes only, **but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes**. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form, or apply online on the BSHA website.

BSHA RIHS Amateur qualifiers

Classes 20, 24 & 29 are qualifiers for the inaugural Amateur Championships at The Royal International Horse Show. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob class. The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship. Please refer to rule 7b in the 2022 BSHA Rulebook. The Amateur qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but qualification cannot be granted to those competing on a day ticket. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Longines Royal International Horse Show 26 – 30 July 2022 must submit their entries ONLINE at: www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling/longines-fei-jumping-nations[1]cup-of-great-britain-at-the-longines-royal-international-horse-show/ Schedules will be available to download by 1st April and entries close on 6th June 2022 (closing date will be subject to change due to current COVID regulations).

UK PONIES & HORSES GOLD MEDAL SERIES - Classes 18 & 19 are qualifiers for the Gold Medal Series at the 2023 UKPH Spring Classic, Equifest 2023 and BSPA 2023.. The 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each qualifying class will qualify. Qualification cards will not be awarded in the ring however placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary.

This show is affiliated to the NCPA (Affiliation Number 103/22) and is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show in September 2022. 1st & 2nd prizewinners in Class 17 will qualify.

Special Prize: The BL Bane Perpetual Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the Champion Hack.

Class 17 **Novice Hack** - Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 160cms. Not won a first prize of £35 or more, or more than a total of £250 (including Championship Prize Money) in any showing classes excluding Working Show Horses, Best Trained, Pairs, Side Saddle or In-Hand classes that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. See Rule 6E. BSHA Rule Book 2022. Exhibitors in this class can compete on a Day Ticket (Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form from the BSHA website).

Class 18 RIHS Small Hack Qualifier - Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 154cms.

Class 19 RIHS Large Hack Qualifier - Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 154cms but not exceeding 160cms.

Championship: The horses placed 1st and 2nd in Classes 17 - 19 are eligible to go through to the Championship.

Class 20 RIHS Amateur Hack - Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms. The Small Hack must not exceed 154cms, the Large Hack must not exceed 160cms. Highest unqualified Small and Large Hack to qualify. Please refer to Rule 7B in the BSHA Rulebook.

Amateur Championship:

The horses placed 1st and 2nd in Classes 20, 24 & 29 are eligible to go forward. Championship to take place following the conclusion of Class 29.

Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.** Classes 22 & 23 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then third will go forward. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Longines Royal International Horse Show 26-31 July 2022 must submit their entries ONLINE at: www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling. Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter Sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The highest placed unqualified prize winners in all **Open** affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of the Year Classes at the National Championship Show in September 2022. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and

- Class 112 **Private Driving Class -** For horses/ponies any height, 4 years and over to be driven single, pair or tandem to a suitable vehicle, (Commercial vehicles and hackney show wagons are not permitted). NOTE: THERE IS NO ROAD DRIVE. Competitors entering this Class are not permitted to enter the Pleasure Driving Class.

Class to be split at Judge's discretion into 2 sections if sufficient entries. Both sections will be in the ring at the same time.

Section 1 – Singles exceeding 13.2hh

Section 2 – Singles not exceeding 13.2hh.

The entries placed 1st and 2nd in each section of Class 112 are eligible to go through to the Championship.

Class 113 **Concours de Elegance Class** - For horses/ponies any height, 4 years and over. Judged by artist the most elegant turnout. Picture he/she would most like to paint.

- Class 114 Lady Whip/Gentleman Whip Class For horses/ponies any height, 4 years and over. This is to be judged entirely on the ability of the driver and good horsemanship. Turnout safe and tidy. Open to any vehicle.
- Class 115 Pleasure Driving Class Pleasure Driving Classes are for newcomers to showing and not intended for those who show in private driving classes. Regular showing competitors are asked to respect this and entries for the pleasure driving class will not be accepted from those who enter our private driving class. To be judged 15% vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness, 15% harness suitability, fit and cleanliness, 70% driver and groom, horse/pony way of going and suitability as a family pleasure animal. Competitors may be required to drive and halt between two pairs of cones and execute a U-turn in their individual show. This class will be split into two sections;

Section 1 – Non Pneumatics tyres

Section 2 – Pneumatics tyres specially designed for carriages (i.e. not car tyres)

Class 116 **Exercise Vehicle Class -** 2 or 4 wheeled. Open to horses and ponies, any height. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specially designed for carriages (i.e. not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

The Roger Sutton Memorial Trophy - This class can also be entered as part of a joint competition with The Royal Cheshire County Show held at Clay House Farm, Knutsford on 21st & 22nd June 2022 in memory of Roger Sutton who so enjoyed private driving in Cheshire. To be eligible for the trophy, competitors must enter the Exercise Vehicle class at both shows and enter both Shows by 22 May. Points will be awarded at both shows (1st - 5 points, 2nd - 4 points, 3rd - 3 points, 4th - 2 points, competing but unplaced - 1 point) and the competitor with the highest amalgamated points will be awarded the Roger Sutton Memorial Trophy, sash and £100, the competitor placed 2nd will be awarded a rosette and £50. In the event of a tie there will be a drive off following the class at The Royal Cheshire County Show. The judge of the drive off may not necessarily be a BDS judge. Entries must comprise the same whip/horse/vehicle combination at both shows. All entries in the Shetland Classes must be registered with the Shetland Pony Stud Book Society by the closing date of entry. Ponies must be named on entry form. In order to enter a Stallion Class at an Affiliated Show, entire males, aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion Assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Children under 14 years old may NOT show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-Hand Classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-Hand Classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Society rosettes will only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (i.e. foals.) A best foal rosette will be awarded to the winner of Class 118 and a best miniature rosette will be awarded to the winner of class 122.

This show is affiliated to **Ponies Association (UK) (Affiliation Number 22/A18/8305). UK PONIES & HORSES GOLD MEDAL SERIES -** Classes 117 & 119 - 121 are qualifiers for the Gold Medal Series at the 2023 UKPH Spring Classic, Equifest 2023 and BSPA 2023. The 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each qualifying class will qualify. Qualification cards will not be awarded in the ring however placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary.
