#### **ENTRY FEES:**

#### PRIZES:

Rosettes 1 - 6 in all classes plus Champion & Reserve Rosettes Prize Money RIHS classes only: 1<sup>st</sup> £ 25 2<sup>nd</sup> £ 15 3<sup>rd</sup> £ 10

#### **RULES:**

#### **RESPONSIBILITY:**

We shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever whilst entering on, or leaving the Society's premises, for any damage or loss, however caused to the property of such person, or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person. We shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his employee or to any animal, article or property brought into the showground, or whilst entering or on leaving, or being carried into or out of the said showground. The exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought into the showground by him/her and he/she shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from all action, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.

#### REFUSAL OR CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES:

The Chairman/Vice Chairman of the Show Committee, in their absolute discretion may, without assigning any reason, refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted or may decline to admit to the Showground any animal or exhibitor or person or withhold any prize. Whenever under this regulation any entry is refused or cancelled, or any exhibit, exhibitor or person is refused admission or is removed, the fees paid for such entry may, at the discretion of the Show Chairman/Vice Chairman, be refunded and if refunded, shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society, its officers, servants or assistants.

#### ACCESS ONTO SHOWGROUND:

The Chairman/Vice Chairman of the Show Committee shall have power to suspend or remove from the Showground, at the expense and risk of the person responsible, their stock or property, or anyone who shall infringe any of the Conditions or Regulations of the Society or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards, or whose conduct shall in the opinion of the Chairman/Vice Chairman of the Show Committee be derogatory to the character or prejudicial to the interests of the Society or its members, or who in the opinion of the Chairman/Vice Chairman of the Show Committee have been guilty of any act or omission involving cruelty or unnecessary suffering to, or neglect of, any animal, and all forfeits, fees and charges shall be due by the person responsible before any removal from the Showground takes place.

#### DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES AND COMMITTEE:

Each exhibitor shall abide by and accept as Final the decisions of the Judges and Officials of the Show who shall have power in their absolute and controlled discretion to withhold any cup or prize for want of merit or lack of competition in any class or otherwise.

CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES:

All persons in charge of stock will be subject to the orders of the Officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees.

#### **ANIMAL WELFARE:**

We expect all exhibitors to observe a best practice at all times.

#### AMALGAMTION OF ENTRIES:

In the event of there being fewer than THREE entries in any breed section the classes for such breed may be amalgamated.

#### **REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:**

Any entry fee paid shall not be refundable, except in the case of an animal incapacitated by accident, injury or illness. Any claim under this clause must be made in writing to the Secretary and must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a Veterinary Surgeon to be received not later than the 24<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

#### PROTESTS:

Any exhibitor wishing to make a protest having reference to a horse exhibited at the show, must make the same in writing to the Secretary and must deposit a sum of £25. If upon investigation the protest is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Stewards, the sum thus deposited shall be forfeited to the Area funds. All protests must be delivered to the Show before 5.00pm on the day on which the award shall have been made and no protest will be subsequently received unless a satisfactory reason be given for the delay.

#### PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:

All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover.

#### HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK REGULATION:

Exhibitors are reminded that they are responsible for the observation by themselves, their employees and their contractors or all Health and Safety at Work regulations. Any item of risk or hazard should be reported to the secretary.

#### HAT STANDARDS:

Any person riding a horse anywhere on the showground is required to wear a hard hat of a standard approved by their appropriate governing body and ensure that the chin strap is fastened.

Handlers of ponies in in-hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull caps/riding hat that meets one of the above standards.

#### FOALS:

No foals under the age of THREE WEEKS will be allowed on the showground.

#### **EQUINE INFLUENZA:**

Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses and ponies attending the showground. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of a vaccination. Foals 6 months old and under are exempt.

#### DRESS CODE:

Grooms/Attendants appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and in proper dress code, with appropriate headwear.

#### **MOBILE PHONES:**

The use of mobile phones is not permitted within the collecting and judging rings.

#### TIMETABLE:

Classes may commence at or after the published time. The Society will not be responsible for any loss where an exhibitor has made entries in more than one class and because of a time overrun it is not possible for him/her or the horse/pony to compete in one or more later classes. No claim for a refund of fees paid or other loss, direct, indirect or consequential will be accepted or paid. Once a class has commenced trotting it is deemed the class is closed and no further exhibitors may enter the ring

#### FALL OF HORSE/PONY OR RIDER:

A fall of horse/pony or rider during any class will result in elimination. The rider must not remount in the ring and should see a medically qualified attendant before remounting.

#### OWNERS/HANDLERS:

All horses must have a competent person in charge.

#### AGE OF RIDERS:

There is no age limit for riders in most classes with the exception of Stallions in that riders must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January of the current year when riding small breeds (Shetland, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh A and Welsh B) and their 14th birthday before 1st January of the current year for large breeds (Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D).

Children must be three years of age before competing in any classes.

#### STUD BOOK BREEDS:

All exhibits must be registered in the Stud Book or Register of their respective Breed or Type. All Stallions and Colts two years old and over must hold a current Stallion licence, unless otherwise governed by their individual Breed Society. In the case of a false pedigree being given on the entry form any prizes won will be forfeited. This also applies to animals competing in part-bred M&M classes.

No ponies may be plaited in M&M classes.

#### **ARTIFICAL AIDS:**

In all ridden classes, the wearing of spurs if forbidden and show canes/whips must not exceed 30".

#### **ENTRIES:**

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to enter their ponies in the correct class or classes. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by full fees.

#### **CLASS RULES:**

THE NPS GENERAL RULES FOR SHOWING APPLY.

NPS/SUPREME PRODUCTS M&M WHP RIHS QUALIFIERS:

The owner must be a Qualifying member of the NPS for the pony to enter the NPS/ SUPREME PRODUCTS M&M WHP RIHS Championship classes at this show.

#### NPS WINTER / SUMMER QUALIFIERS:

Classes are open to Members and Non-Members of the NPS, but Non-Members will need to become members to enter the finals at the NPS Spring Festival 2024 or the NPS Summer Championships 2024. The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final. Qualification goes no lower than third.

#### NPS SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. The owner's valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

#### NPS PLAITED QUALIFIERS:

The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition or to qualify but the owner must be a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS to enter the final.

Please note the following regulations in the interests of safety:

- It is the owner's due diligence to ensure that horses and ponies are not left unattended whilst tied to the side of trailers or lorries.
- Exhibitors are not allowed to set up corrals in the lorry park.

- Dogs must be kept on a lead and under control at all times whilst on the Showground. The showground requires dog waste to be picked up and disposed of with domestic waste, in a suitable container. Please do not place dog waste with stable manure. PLEASE TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOUR DOG.
- Bicycles, scooters, skateboards etc. are not allowed within the Showground.
- Ponies must only be exercised in the designated areas and must at all times proceed at a walk on the roadways.
- Sleeping or cooking in the stables is not permitted.
- Please obey the instructions of the Show Committee, Stable Management Team or any other Official at all times.

#### Including NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette

Open to youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. Four classes as above (may be amalgamated into two classes, either spilt by age or by breed size (large and small). Handler any age, except stallions (see rules in section A 3.2). Foals are not eligible at the Final. The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition or to qualify but the owner must be a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS to enter the final. In each class the three highest placed ponies which have not already qualified, within the first six places, will qualify for the final at the NPS Spring Festival.

The Silver Medal Rosette Championship is for youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. Foals are not eligible for this Championship. All 1st placed prize winners are eligible to go forward to the silver medal championship. Where classes are amalgamated, the highest placed of each breed may go forward to the Championship at that Show. The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter the championship but only ponies owned by NPS Qualifying or Life members can receive the Silver Medal Rosette and qualify for the final at which a Gold Medal is presented. (see section A 1.3 a). The Silver Medal Rosette and qualification goes to the Champion, if owned by an NPS member. If the Champion is not owned by an NPS member the Silver Medal Rosette and qualification goes to the Reserve if it is owned by an NPS member. Silver Medal Rosette to go no lower than first Reserve (third) provided it is owned by an NPS Member. Ponies qualifying go forward to the Silver Medal Rosette Championship final at the NPS Summer Championship show.

#### Class 5 IN HAND PLAITED RIDING PONY / HORSE / HUNTER PONY / HACK / PART BRED

Open to horses & ponies any age - stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding. Handler any age, except for stallions or colts where the handler must be 14 years of age or over.

### Class 6 NPS/ ROSETTES DIRECT STUD SHOW PONY / SHOW HUNTER PONY NOVICE RIDDEN NOT EXCEEDING 153CMS

Open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, not exceeding 153cms (show ponies not exceeding 148cms), registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register.

Qualification will be awarded to the highest placed Show Pony not exceeding 148cm and the highest placed Show Hunter Pony not exceeding 153cm.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following: Won an Open affiliated SP/SHP ridden class; Qualified for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS Open SP/SHP Ridden classes; Qualified for the SP/SHP Novice Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year); If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Novice SP/SHP Final.

Riders to be of a suitable size for the pony. Riders must be 12 years old or over when riding stallions not exceeding 128 cm and 14 years old or over when riding stallions exceeding 128cms. The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition or to qualify but the owner must be a Qualifying or Life members of the NPS to enter the final. The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit. This class is not open to Leading Rein or First Ridden. A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds.

### Class 7 NPS/ROBERTSON-BELL OPEN RIDDEN SHOW PONY / SHOW HUNTER PONY NOT EXCEEDING 153CMS

Open to stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over, not exceeding 153cms (show ponies not exceeding 148cms), registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register.

Qualification will be awarded to the highest placed Show Pony not exceeding 148 and the highest placed Show Hunter Pony not exceeding 153cm.

Rider to be suitable size for pony. Riders must be 12 years old or over when riding stallions not exceeding 128cm and 14 years old or over when riding stallions exceeding 128cms. The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition or to qualify but the owner must be a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS to enter the final. The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. To be shown in any suitable bridle. This class is not open to Leading Rein or First Ridden. A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds.

#### Class 8 NPS/THE ANDREWS FAMILY PART BRED RIDDEN QUALIFIER

Open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, any height. A) Part Bred Arab. Horse/pony to be registered in the part bred or anglo arab section of the Arab Horse Society with a minimum of 12.5% Arab blood. B) Part bred M&M pony to be registered in the part bred section of one of the M&M studbooks with a minimum of 12.5% of that breed blood. Registration numbers must be stated on the entry form.

Rider any age, except stallions (see rules in section A 3.2). The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition but only ponies owned by NPS Qualifying or Life members can qualify for the final. The highest placed pony, owned by an NPS member, in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. Leading Rein and First Ridden ponies are not eligible. To be shown in any suitable bridle. A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. Horses/ponies may be shown plaited or unplaited to suit type.

## Class 9 NPS/ROSETTES DIRECT INTERMEDIATE RIDDEN NOVICE SHOW RIDING & SHOW HUNTER TYPE EXCEEDING 148CMS AND NOT EXCEEDING 158CMS

Open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms, registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following: Won an Open affiliated SP/SHP ridden class; Qualified for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS Open SP/SHP Ridden classes; Qualified for the SP/SHP Novice Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year); If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Novice SP/SHP Final.

Riders to be of a suitable size for the pony. Riders must be 12 years old or over when riding stallions not exceeding 128cms and 14 years old or over when riding stallions exceeding 128cms. The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition or to qualify but the owner must be a Qualifying or Life members of the NPS to enter the final. The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit. This class is not open to Leading Rein or First Ridden. A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds.

#### Ridden championship (for classes 6 – 9)

#### UK PONIES & HORSES YOUNG RIDERS ROYAL INTERNATIONAL RIDDEN M&M

#### TO BE JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES OF UK PONIES & HORSES LIMITED

Owners must be Adult / Life Members, Riders must be current UK Ponies & Horses Limited Annual Members and the ponies currently registered with UK Ponies & Horses Limited before time of entry in order to compete in these classes. Open to Mountain and Moorland Ridden Stallion (Intermediate class only), Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over. Registered in their approved Pure Breed Society Stud Books of Connemara, Dartmoor, Dales, Exmoor, Fells, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C or D.

(See Rule 7 of the current UK PONIES & HORSES Rule Book).

The highest placed exhibit in Classes 10 to 12 not already qualified within the first five will qualify for the UK Ponies & Horses Limited RIHS Young Riders M&M Ridden Final to take place at Hickstead in July 2024.

Qualification will be verified by the office.

- Class 10 UK PONIES & HORSES LIMITED RIHS SMALL BREEDS Mare or Gelding, 4 years old & over. Registered in their approved Pure Breed Society stud books of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh Section A or B. Rider not to have attained their 14th Birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

Stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. Ponies may be measured at the judge's discretion and must be within the specified height range for their breed. Rider any age, except stallions (see rules in section A 3.2). Riders may only ride one pony in each class. Height of fences as per the NPS rule book.

Riders must have competed in at least 2 M&M WHP Royal International Horse Show qualifying rounds before competing in the Final at the Royal International Horse Show and must send proof of this to the office as per the instructions on the allocated qualifying card.

The owner has to be a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS for the pony to enter this competition and the card must be produced in the prize giving for the qualification to be awarded. (N.B. At the final at Hickstead the rider must also be a NPS member). The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final at RIHS. Where this pony has already qualified, the pony standing next in line that has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than third place (N.B. Qualification has to be verified by the NPS Office). The pony is to be in possession of a valid JMB height certificate no later than a month before the final. Entries into the final at Hickstead are the responsibility of the owner and are made directly to RIHS.

The course will consist of a minimum of twelve numbered fences, a minimum of two of which must be spreads. A water tray (containing water) as well as a change of direction must be included, and a natural water splash is optional, the use of water trays as a water splash is prohibited on the grounds of safety. If a hazard is included, it will be numbered and judged as a fence. The water splash is treated for marking purposes like any other obstacle. Competitors may splash through it or jump it, both approaches are acceptable. A water splash will be included in the final at Hickstead.
