GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS. (THIS SHOW WILL BE RUN IN LINE WITH ANY COVID RELATED GUIDELINES THAT MAY BE IN PLACE AT THE TIME IF APPLICABLE).

The show Is run In accordance with SHB(GB) 2022 Rules except Horse of the Year Show classes, which are run under BSHA/Horse of the Year Show rules. In all HOYS classes, Horse of the Year Show rules take precedence, a copy of which can be downloaded from **www.hoys.co.uk.** Horses must be registered with the BSHA and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.** Classes 38 - 42 & 49 & 50 are qualifiers for **Horse of the Year Show**, NEC, Birmingham, 5th – 9th October 2022. In classes 38 - 42 no horse lower than fifth will qualify. The Championship of classes 49 & 50, no horse lower than third will qualify. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show Office.

Horses competing at the Horse of the Year Show and qualifying shows in The Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes. Entries in these classes may not compete in the Small Show Hunter of the Year and vice versa.

MEMBERSHIP

Owners and riders of horses in all ridden classes must be full members of SHB(GB), unless competing on a day ticket with the exception of the Ridden Irish Draught Classes, Ridden Mare class, Ridden Cleveland Bay classes and Horse of the Year Show classes. Exhibitors in In Hand classes do not have to be members.

SAFETY/INSURANCE

The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

OBJECTIONS

Objections of any kind must be made in writing, and delivered to the Secretary, within one hour of the close of the judging of the class concerned, accompanied by a deposit of Two Hundred & Fifty Pounds, which deposit will be forfeited if the objection should prove to be frivolous. The Objector must also state the particular and precise character of his objection. All objections will be referred to the Council, whose decision will be final.

PRIZES

In unsponsored ridden classes, prize money may be reduced on the following sliding scale: 3 entries - money to 1st Place only; 5 entries - money to 2nd Place only; 6 entries - money to 3rd Place only; 9 entries - money to 4th Place.

BROOD MARE PREMIUMS

Brood Mare Premiums will be awarded in classes 21, 23, 25, 43, 53, 58 & 60. Premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward. The premium takes the form of a rosette and Service Voucher to the value of £100, awarded at the Judge's discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used in either of the two years following the year of that award. The owner must be, or become, a fully paid up member of the SHB(GB) in order to be eligible for the award. No mare shall take more than one award per year.

PROGENY OF GRADED MARES

In classes 22, 24, 26, 27 - 35 incl, 52, 54 -57 incl, 59, 61 & 62 - 67 incl. A rosette will be awarded to the highest placed exhibit out of a SHB(GB) graded mare.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

All horses eligible for championships must be forward.

ENTRIES

The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes in the event of insufficient entries. Every effort will be made for classes not to clash, but once a class has started a horse cannot leave the ring to compete in another class and then return to the original class.

Entry forms must be accompanied by the correct entry fees. Entries close on 24th August 2022 at 12 noon. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR ANY REASON AFTER THIS DATE. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE. Entries will not be acknowledged unless a SAE is enclosed. Numbers will be available for collection from the secretary's office at the show.

FIRST AID A first aid fee of £6 per rider or In Hand exhibitor is payable at time of entry - see entry form.

STABLING

FARRIER

A farrier will be on call – details will be publicised at the show and available from the Stable Manager's office.

ENTRIES

Entries for all classes close on 24th August 2022 at 12 noon. NO ENTRIES OR STABLE BOOKINGS WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR ANY REASON AFTER THIS DATE. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.

Entries & stable bookings can be made online via entrymaster - see SHB(GB) website or alternatively can be posted the SHB(GB) office. All entries, except foals, must be in possession of current Influenza Vaccination Certificate and such document, which must undeniably relate to the horse in question, must accompany the animal when brought to the Show and may be examined.

All entries must be on the Society's Identity Record or Stud Book before the entry is accepted unless competing on a day ticket or in a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier - see conditions as printed on day ticket application form which is available to download from **www.sporthorsegb.co.uk**.

Entries in the In Hand Irish Draught classes, Ridden Irish Draught classes, Ridden Mare class, In hand Cleveland Bay classes & Ridden Cleveland Bay classes do not have to be registered with SHB(GB) and exhibitors do not have to be members of SHB(GB), but if competing in any other classes at the show a day ticket must be purchased. Foals at foot do not have to be registered in their own right.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF ENTRIES AND ALLOCATION OF NUMBERS

Please note that receipt of entries will not be acknowledged unless a SAE is enclosed with entries. Numbers will be available for collection from the Secretary's Office at the show between 2pm & 5pm on Sunday 4th September, between 7am & 5pm on Monday 5th September and between 7am & 1pm on Tuesday 6th September.

General Data Protection Regulation

Please note that there will be a photographer on site and photographs taken may be used on the SHB(GB) website, Facebook page and may be issued to Third Party Publications for the purpose of publicising the show, results and general PR in relation to SHB(GB). In addition class sponsors may receive pictures of awards to prize winners. If you do not want any pictures that may be taken of you/your horse utilised in this way please make the Secretary's office at the show aware.

Sport Horse Breeding (GB) Equine Influenza Vaccinations Policy

Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses competing in Sport Horse Breeding (GB) affiliated classes. Two injections for primary vaccination, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart, are required before being eligible to compete. A first booster injection must be given within seven months after the second injection of primary vaccination. Subsequent booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year, commencing after the first booster injection. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Sport Horse Breeding (GB) website. The current FEI ruling is for a six monthly booster as opposed to annual; therefore it is recommended that all competitors/exhibitors/members/producers check with shows that fall under FEI regulation before entering, e.g. Windsor, Hickstead, HOYS etc. NOTE: THE ABOVE WILL BE ENFORCED AT THE 2022 NATIONAL HUNTER SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW AND THE SOCIETY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CARRY OUT PASSPORT/VACCINATION RECORD CHECKS. ANY UNVACCINATED HORSES TOGETHER WITH ANY ANIMALS THEY ARE IN TRANSIT WITH WILL BE TURNED AWAY FROM THE SHOWGROUND.

Classes 1 & 2 are affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible to compete. The owners of all pure bred Irish Draught horses in ridden classes must be full members of the IDHS (GB). This rule does not apply to owners of Irish Draught Sport Horses. Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility. All competing Stallions must be the progeny of a graded mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB) AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) by a Class 1 Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion and be inspected or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 OR be a Registered Irish Draught Sport Horse Stallion, and they must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over. All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

This class will be judged in two parts. Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

CLASS 50. WESTOWN STUD HEAVY WEIGHT WORKING HUNTER OF THE YEAR.

This competition is for Heavyweight Working Hunters, mares, geldings or stallions (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old or over, exceeding 158cm, capable of carrying over 12 stone 7lbs, to be ridden. All owners, riders & producers to be members of BSHA. Horses must be registered with BSHA. Middleweight Hunters to be Included In this category. Failure to jump in the correct section will result In elimination.

Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse

as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. Fences will not exceed 1.14m (3ft 9ins) in height, there should be a minimum of 8 fences and a maximum of 12 fences. The Course must contain a combination and should contain a water tray. This class will be judged in two parts. Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation if so required (no change of rider is allowed). For classes 49 and 50 marks will be awarded in the following way: **PHASE I** (60 MARKS) A: JUMPING POINTS - 40 MARKS B: STYLE WHILE JUMPING - 20 MARKS **PHASE II** (40 MARKS) C: CONFORMATION - 20 MARKS D: RIDE - 20 MARKS

In the event of equality the CONFORMATION MARK from Phase II will take precedence, followed by the RIDE MARK, and then the STYLE MARK.
