



How The Event Works

Competitors May compete in one or as many classes as they wish. There are individual Championships in most disciplines.

Points are awarded in Ridden, working Hunter, Dressage, Show Jumping, Arena Eventing & Horse Trial Classes as follows

1st 6 points, 2nd 5 points, 3rd 4 points, 4th 3 points 5th 2 points & 6th 1 points

Points from OPEN classes are added together to find the individual Performance Champions in Sections A,B,C,D, Small Part-bred & Large Part-bred. Then the Animal with the highest number of points out of the six sections will be the Supreme Open Performance Champion

Points from Novice classes are added together to find the individual Performance Champions in Novice Sections A,B,C,D, Small Part-bred & Large Part-bred. Then the Animal with the highest number of points out of the six sections will be the Supreme Novice Performance Champion

BREED SHOW RULES APPLY

NPS Qualifying Rounds, Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non members and at breed shows ponies can qualify for finals even if their owners are not members. Owners of qualified ponies must become adult Qualifying or Life members to enter the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 6th to 8th august 2024. The highest placed pony, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships, Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. At breed shows Silver Medals may be won by non-members. The owner of the qualified pony must become an Adult Qualifying or Life member to enter the final. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

In Mountain & Moorland classes <u>riders of stallions</u> must be 12 years old or over when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, welsh A & B) For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders of stallions must be 14 years old or over. The ages of riders and handlers are all taken as at 1st January of the current year.

<u>Stallion Discs-</u> All In Hand Stallions are advised to wear a bridle disc when showing in NPS classes. As with ridden stallions, for which it remains compulsory, these may be from any UK society as long as they are easily identified or an NPS Stallion Disc may be purchased from the NPS Office.

British Dressage Tests Prelim 13 & Novice 34 will be used for all qualifiers.

Each test will consist of the following six sections all of which will have Their own

Final:

- 1. Registered Mountain & Moorland breeds not exceeding 138cm
- 2. Registered Mountain & Moorland breeds exceeding 138cm
- 3. Registered British Riding Ponies
- 4. Part Bred Horses/Ponies registered with their appropriate Native Breed Part Bred Stud Book including Part Bred Arab ponies over stamped in the British Riding Pony Stud book and ponies registered with the British Sports Pony Stud Book. Please note Part Bred Native ponies and Sports ponies over stamped within the British Riding Pony & Stud Book may only compete in one section per season.
- 5. Highest placed Mini rider aged under 12 years on 1st January 2024
- 6. Highest placed Junior rider under 18 years on 1st January 2024

The two highest placed ponies in each section at each qualifying show will qualify for the 2024 Final and also be eligible to be chosen to represent their Breed, NPS Area or other team in the Team Challenge which will be incorporated into the 2024 Championship Final.

Qualifying rounds are open to competitors from the UK and elsewhere. All qualifiers will receive a qualification card,

The Final will run in accordance with the 2023/2024 NPS Dressage Rules which will be available to all NPS Members. Copyright .All Rights Reserved 2020 Horse/ponies must be ridden at the Final by the qualifying rider.

You must be fully paid up Dressage, Qualifying or Life members of the NPS for 2025 in order to compete at the Final.

At the Final the winners of each section for each Test will be invited to perform a 5 minute Freestyle to Music for the judging of the Overall NPS Supreme Dressage titles. Ponies may only compete in this section once even if they have won both their Preliminary & Novice section Finals.

NPS – Team Challenge

A Team Challenge is incorporated in the 2025 Championship Final. Each Team to comprise four ponies and riders who have qualified for any section of the NPS Supreme Dressage Championships 2024/2025. All four Team Ponies scores to count. Each Pony & Rider combination may only compete for one Team.

There will be both Preliminary & Novice Team Championships plus overall Supreme Team awards for Teams competing in both Tests.

NPS ARENA EVENTING CHALIENGE Classes 27 to 32

NPS/ANTHONY EVANS Arena Eventing Challenge (AE) Open to mares, geldings and stallions four year old and over, maximum height 158cm, in possession of an equine passport but no specific registration or breed society criteria. Ponies' manes may be plaited at competitor discretion. Riders may only ride one pony in each class. The NPS strongly recommends body protectors are worn in all NPS jumping competitions especially over fixed obstacles. Qualifying rounds must be run over a course that contains both show jumping style fences and arena eventing style fences. Qualification will be to awarded to all pomies placing in the top ten. Classes at the Final will be split into two sections: A. Ponies who have qualified in 60cm to 70cm qualifying rounds. Maximum height of fences at the final 70cm B. Ponies who have qualified in 75cm to 90cm qualifying rounds. Maximum height of fences at the final 90cm

Owners of qualified ponies must become adult Qualifying, Performance or Life members to enter the final of the competition to be held at Aston Le Walls in September 2024.

These classes will be calculated from existing rounds in Dressage, Arena Eventing classes and the First round of Show Jumping, but note that the scores from Dressage and Show Jumping will be amended to the Horse Trials scoring system. No extra rounds will be ridden.. The entry fee for this class will be £15.00.

- 2 . The judges', stewards` and committee's decision to be final in all cases. Should any exhibitor conduct himself or herself in an improper or offensive manner they may be asked to leave the Showground.
- 3. Any exhibitor wishing to lodge protest to any person or exhibit must do so in writing to the Secretary and at the same time deposit the surn of £25. All protests to be delivered within one hour of the incident. If on investigation by the show committee the protest is not sustained, the deposit may be forfeited to the show funds.
- 4 The committee reserves the right to amend the judges panel if necessary and to alter the programme according to their requirements. The committee reserves the right to amalgamate or divide classes.
- 5 All trophies and plaques remain the property of the show committee and are awarded on condition that they are returned undamaged
- 6 The closing date for entries is 12th May 2023 .No late entries will be accepted. No entries are accepted unless accompanied by the correct entry fee at the time of receipt of the entry form.
- 7. Every exhibitor will be held responsible for the correctness of his entry. Full details and registration numbers must be on entry form.
- 8. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 9. The committee will not be responsible for any inaccuracy in any pedigree or other particulars inserted in the catalogue, although all reasonable care will be taken to ensure the accuracy of particulars printed therein.
- 10. All exhibits must be registered with the Welsh Pony & Cob Society in their relevant Sections.
- 11. All persons riding horses/ponies on the show site must wear protective headgear to the current approved BSI standard with the chin strap fastened at all times. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
- 12. All dogs on the showground must be kept on leads. No dogs to enter any rings or competition areas
- 13. All exhibits must be four years old and over on the day of the show.
- 14. Exhibitors must not enter an animal when a person who is the breeder or who has had a financial interest in the animal will judge the animal.
- 15. No manes or tails to be plaited in any class .for sections A,B,C & D plaiting for part breds is optional
- 16 Exhibitors should ensure that they are adequately covered by third party insurance

- 17 No refunds will be given under any circumstances unless the show is cancelled
- 18. Entries may not be substituted after the closing date.
- 19. In the event of a tie in a class the points will be added for the relevant placing's and divided equally. Points for lower placing's will be adjusted accordingly.
- 20 When there is a fall of horse or rider whilst competing in any class, then that competitor is eliminated and under no circumstances will be allowed to remount in the ring or on the course. A medical examination must be undergone before riding in subsequent classes.
- 21 In the event of a tie for points championships the winner will be decided by the highest number of 1^{st} prizes won, failing that by the highest number of 2^{nd} prizes and so on.
- 22 SPURS may be worn in show jumping , dressage & hunter trials BUT NOT in ridden or working hunter classes.
- 23 It is the exhibitors responsibility to make sure they are using the appropriate tack for the discipline they are competing in.
- 24 All Horses attending the event must be up to date with Flu vaccinations
